These plants are reported to be tolerant of occasional to frequent exposure to salt water, either through ocean water or de-icing salts.

Salt tolerance generally means that salt exposure will not be fatal to the plant. Some leaf burning may still occur.

Always use care when applying de-icing salts near plantings. A thorough flushing of soil in spring will help to eliminate residual salt in garden beds.
