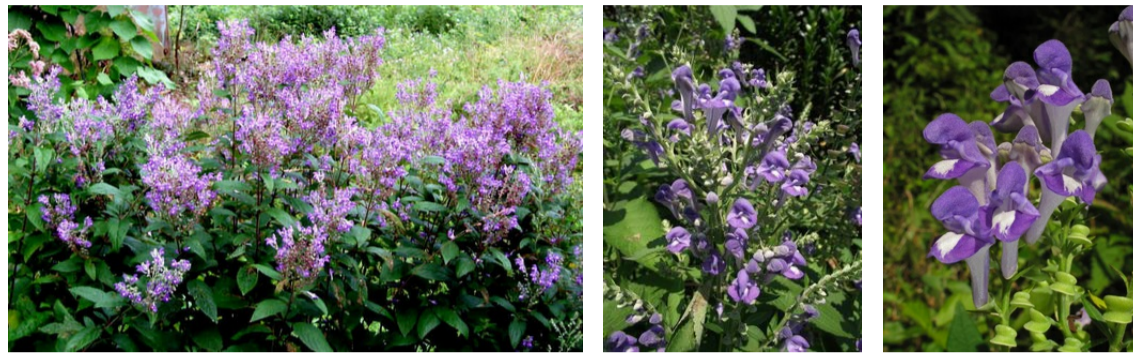

DOWNY SKULLCAP... No Skull and Crossbones Required!

Skull cap is named for the the helmet or skull shaped capsule that protects the seed of ripened flowers. No woeful tales of poisoning are associated with this easy-care late-summer bloomer.

- Deer resistant
- Butterflies
- Full to Part Sun or Part Shade
- Average to Dry Soil
- Drought Resistant, Clay Soil OK
- 2'-3'; Blooms blue-violet late summer to early fall
- Perennial gardens, meadow, back of border.

Plant in combination with Black Eyed Susan for multi-colored impact

Our crop of Downy Skullcap is seed grown from locally collected seed. Seed grown crops ensure important genetic diversity in the landscape.



CLETHRA...

...or Summersweet, attracts butterflies and pollinators, and is a great alternative to Butterfly Bush. Its bright green leaves are followed by fragrant spires of flowers in mid to late summer. They prefer a moist to wet site, sun to shade. They are well suited for clay soil and wet areas. One of the few late summer blooming shrubs for shade!

Clethra alnifolia: Grows 4' or more, white blossoms. One of the easiest butterfly shrubs you can have. This is the 'straight species' that occurs naturally in low areas around woodlands and wetlands.

Clethra alnifolia 'Ruby Spice': This selection bears deep rose-colored, non-fading fragrant flowers. 4'-6' high.

Clethra 'Hummingbird': White blooming, grows to 3' tall. A dwarf selection.
