MONARDA PUNCTATA Spotted Bee Balm

Named after a famous 16th century Spanish botanist, Monarda punctata is native to prairies, meadows and pastures throughout the U.S. Its striking flower in shades of pink-purple, green, beige and maroon attracts butterflies, skippers, hummingbird moths, hummingbirds, honeybees, bumblebees and other native bees.

Endangered in PA, this easy-to-grow biennial or short lived perennial will return to your garden year after year if you let it go to seed.

- Average to Dry Soil, Sandy Soil Best
- Drought Resistant, Fragrant
- Special Value to Bumble Bees and Native Bees
- Attracts beneficial insects that prey upon pest insects
