Joe Pye Weed: Joe Pye stands tall in the mucky soil along river banks, its expansive mauve blossoms a resting place for small birds and butterflies. It is not unusual to see three or more butterflies on a single blossom. Joe Pye provides larval food for more than three dozen butterfly species and is host to skippers, beetles, bees and beneficial wasps. There is nothing demure about Joe Pye: its bold, late summer statement in the back of border heralds the waning days of summer, which is perhaps why it is sometimes called Trumpet Weed.

It will grow well in your sunny garden in average to wet soil. Coastal Joe Pye (*Eupatorium dubium*) stays a little shorter than *Eupatorium maculatum*, which can top out at 6 feet or more if in an ideal spot. If you want butterflies, Joe Pye is the plant for you.
