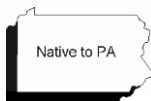


Celtis occidentalis

Hackberry



- 60-100 ft., varies in habit
- Spreads 40 to 60 feet
- Sun to shade, Moist to Dry
- Drought tolerant, pH adaptable, salt & wind tolerant
- Small, inconspicuous greenish-white flowers, April-May
- In fall, orange-brown to dark-purple berries are arranged in clusters
- One of the best trees for providing food and shelter for wildlife. Woodpeckers and cedar waxwings consume fruits.
